




Do You Know 'ME'?

Heep Hong Society - Parents' Resource Centre

All community in this world, including Hong Kong, is comprised of people of different background, status, education level and so on. In analyzing the social structure, one kind of classification is made up of either handicapped person or integrated person. In Hong Kong, handicapped person exceeds twenty thousand, which consists of men and women, adults and children. Handicapped person, whether physical or mental, will encounter different types of obstacles in life, and as such, they need to overcome hindrances that come about psychologically or bodily.

Handicapped children - if given appropriate care and training since early childhood - will be better equipped on entering Society. So as when handicapped children's parents are given appropriate assistance and the relevant knowledge since early beginning, they will be in a better position to assist their children in their growing.

It is certain to say that all parents wish their children could lead a healthy and happy life. However, due to different causes such as diseases or accidents, their children are handicapped physically or mentally. It is not just a great shock to the parents, but they also have to cope with pressure coming from within, or other members of their families, relatives, friends or from the Society. This makes them in a fluster of confusion and anxiety. Therefore, not only handicapped children, but also their parents need the appropriate assistance, counseling and concern.

A family is the most basic unit of Society. If families could live in harmony, then this Society could develop harmoniously. Oppositely, the more problematic families exist, the more unsteady will this Society be. Some parents could not accept the fact of having handicapped children. While without related knowledge, they put the blame on each other and end up with quarrels. This always brings out problematic families. Heep Hong Society for Handicapped Children had seen the necessity of introducing a new service called the "Parents' Resources Centre". The objective of this service is to assist parents with handicapped children in facing and overcoming different types of daily mis-happenings.

Before coming to the services of the Parents' Resources Centre, let's first have a look at the services offered by Heep Hong Society. The Society was set up twenty years ago. This is a non-profit making voluntary service which provides education, training and care services to handicapped children and their parents. The two main services offered by the Society since long are the "Early Education and Training Centre" and the " Child Care Centre". These two services provide for new-born babies and up to six-years old children having physical, mental, learning or behavior problems with special early training before goin; to school. Children receive professional service from " instructors for special child care ", physiotherapists. occupational therapists and social workers through specially

designed "unit education" and individual training organized by the Society. The Society also hold regular parents' meetings, and pay family visits and do out-stretched service. Through special talks and regular visits, the Centres' staff could exchange ideas with parents. Thus, they instinct the parents with more knowledge on child development. This facilitates the Centres' staff and parents' relationship and achieves the aim of helping each other.

The Parents' Resources Centre of the Society is a new attempt. This service differentiates from the other items of the past in which it aims at the service for children. It is obvious that parents could make use of the service offered by the centre to help their children growing and it also helps the parents to solve a lot of problems arise out of daily living. The Parents' Resources Centre is situated at the ground floor of Tung Moon Lau in Tai Hang Tung Estate. It comprises an area of more than 1,000 square feet. Their facilities include a quite big play-room which is full of different types of toys for the children. The toys are placed in an assorted manner, so that children could learn the different assortment objects in addition to playing.

Inside the Centre, there is also a library which keeps related books and magazines, audio-visual materials, phamplets and booklets of related communities The library is also used as a conference institutes. necessity. Other facilities include a pantry and a suite which is comfortably upholstered in order to provide a comparatively and quiet environment for parents to sit and exchange ideas each other. The Centre is taken care by one centre-in-charge three staffs and they handle the daily work of the Centre. also offers other services such as hot-line service to answer parents' questions on rehabilitation, which offer a chance for the parents to understand accept their children under a relaxed atmosphere and the Other services include organizing therapists. psychologists and problematic child care specialists for them to answer questions raised by parents. In doing this, the learn how to help their children, their family and themselves.

Recently, the Parents' Resources Centre has started a project called "Twilight" which is a parents'mutual help scheme. This scheme is a service organized by professional people together with the handicapped children's parents. This service hopes to arrange and through the activities such as "parents playing with their children", "talks", "seminars "and "exchange of ideas" to enable those parents who have never been provided with rehabilitation service with assistance, child care knowledge and skills, so as to lessen their tension when facing problems. One of the parents who is a very active participant of the Centre called Mrs. Lee express her happy feeling that she is very pleased to see the emerge of this kind of scheme. She is herself a voluntary worker of this Centre. She is very willing to help other parents and to exchange experiences with them.

Mrs. Lee's child was handicapped because of deficiency of oxygen in the brain during child birth and was then paralysed. At that time, she was very anxious. After encountering many obstacles, Mrs. Lee's was eventually able to obtain relatively reasonable care for her child. Therefore, Mrs. Lee is of the opinion that the services of the Parents' Resources Centre, and such like, should be enlarged to enable help to more unassisted families. Mrs. Lee also says that the Government has taken too little care on Rehabilitation work and the Government should take up this responsibility.

Our Service -Independent Living Fund

"Owing to my blindness, I am unable to use an ordinary personal computer. I therefore think about buying an device which can perform the functions of transcribing Braille character into Computer language and retrieve information stored in a computer back into the Braille language. But the cost of such a device is so expensive that I am not later on learnt that the Association to afford. T and Medical Volunteer Services established Engineering 'Independent Living Fund' which offered financial assistance the disabled in the form of interest free loan for purchasing The longest redemption period may rehabilitative aids. extended to 30 monthly installments. This way of repaying a few hundred dollars per month is something that I can bear in view of my financial position. I immediately hand in my application, hoping that once my application is being accepted, I will be able to buy the device at the earliest possible moment."

This honest expression is given by one of the applicants of the 'Independent Living Fund'. It concisely reflects the financial obstacles that faced by the handicapped persons when buying rehabilitative aids. It also well proves the worthiness of setting up this Fund in the affirmative.

By obtaining the sponsorship from the 'Marden Foundation Fund', the 'Cheng Chung Pong Charitable Trust', the 'Kao Ke Cheng Charitable Fund' and the 'Duty Free Shoppers Charitable Trust', the 'Independent Living Fund' was able to be founded in June 1990.

This Fund is open to the application of all disabled people. The eligibility for this Fund is to have a personal income of less than HK\$10,000 per month and with a bank saving of less than HK\$30,000. Besides, the application have to be guaranteed by a person with stable income. The loan is given for the purchase of aids necessary for daily livings, for training or for treatment. The maximum loan amount is HK\$25,000 with a maximum repayment term of 30 monthly installments.


Those who are in need could obtain application forms from the Association for completion and return to the Association with photocopies of identity card of self and the guarantor, a quotation sheet and together with Certifications of economic position such as document certifying monthly salary, photocopies of bank passbook.

An interview will then be arranged for the careful study of the Assessment Group. The members of the Group consist of occupational therapist, social worker and the related professionals such as medical practitioner. The many aspects to be examined by the Group include: the extent of necessity of the aid to the applicant, whether the function of the aid is in conformity with the need of the applicant, the capability of the applicant to use the aid and the applicant's repayment ability. After careful consideration, decision would be made.

Since founded, there have been altogether 14 applications throughout. All applicants have been granted the loan to buy rehabilitative aids so as to lead an independent living. Our Association cordially hopes that everyone could pass on the news of this 'Independent Living Fund' so that more needy people can be benefited. Hello! Nice to meet you again! This time I would like to delineate how my work relates to the services of EMV. I mainly contribute my expertise in four main areas.

1. Technical Aids Services to Disabled (TASD)

I will assess the disabled clients and then design suitable and adapted devices for them with the assistance of professional volunteers. Disabled persons can apply for this service individually or being referred by other agencies.

2. Computer Aids Services to Disabled (CASD)

Similarly, I will assess the disabled clients. In collaboration with professional volunteers, suitable computer related devices will be tailor-made for them. Disabled persons can apply for this service individually or being referred by other agencies.


3. Occupational Therapy and Physiotherapy Services

These services are provided on project basis. Volunteers involved in this project are Occupational Therapists and Physiotherapists. At present, the project is focused on the elderlies in Hostels, Aged Homes and Care & Attention Home. Seminars, demonstration and discussions will be organized for the helpers. Interested agencies can apply these services by direct contact with me. I will assess the suitabilities for receiving these services.

4. Care for the Elderly Living Alone

Recently, EMV has organized jointly with the Housing Department to render Domiciliary Occupational Therapy for selected elderlies in Choi Hung and So Uk Estate. I will assess the elderlies at their home and suitable treatment will be provided such as self-care training, functional mobility training, home adaptation, technical aids prescription and etc.


Change of Personnel



這個社會亦會和諧地發展,反之,越多問題家庭、這個社會就顯得動盪不安。有些父母或不能接受自己有弱能子女的事實,再加上缺乏有關知識,便容易將責任歸咎對方導致夫妻不和以致問題家庭的出現。協康會有見及此就推出一個嶄新的服務——家長資源中心,目的是協助弱能子女的家長去面對及克服種種日常生活的問題。

「家長資源中心」是協康會一個較為新穎的服務項目 該服務有別於以往以弱能兒童為主要對象。顧名思義。 家長資源中心是以家長為主要服務對象的。家長可以從資 源中心提供的服務。幫助子女成長及協助解決家長與子女 之間生活上所面對的問題。家長資源中心位於九龍大坑東 邨東滿樓地下, 佔地約千多呎, 内有設施包括一個頗大之 玩具室, 放滿各式各樣的玩具, 以供小朋友取玩, 所有玩 具都分類放置、小朋友取玩之餘還可以學習物件之分類。 中心內還設有一個圖書室,存放有關之書本雜誌等,亦有 視聽資料、剪報、小冊子及相關團體及機構所出版的刊物 該圖書室在有需要時還可以用作會議室之用。其他設施 還包括一個小型廚房及一間佈置得頗為舒適的小房間,為 小朋友的父母提供一個較為溫馨寧靜的環境以便互傾心事 。該中心由一名中心主任及三名職員負責日常之熱線諮詢 服務 為家長解答弱能人士復康服務的問題;並藉著一些 興趣小組活動 讓家長與子女能夠在一個輕鬆的環境下去 接受及了解對方:中心還經常舉辦講座。由不同的專業人 士, 如職業治療師、心理學家、兒童問題專家等去講解有 關問題,使家長能學習更多幫助子女、家人及自己的方法


展能基金

「由於我失明,未能使用普通的電腦,所以我想買一部輔助儀器,可將點字輸入電腦及將儲存於電腦的資料,以點字輸出,但價錢很貴, 我實在沒有能力買。 後來我知道 「工程及醫療義務工作協會」設有 「展能基金」,以免息貸款形式向弱能人士提供經濟援助以購買輔助儀器,最長可分三十個月攤還,每個月還幾佰元,是自己能力所能負擔的,於是,我便立刻申請,希望申請被接納,可儘快買儀器。」

上述是一名「展能基金」申請者的心聲。明確反映弱能人士在購買輔助儀器所面對的經濟困難。亦肯定基金的成立價值。

得到馬登基金、鄭中邦慈善基金、高克正慈善基金、免稅品店慈善基金的贊助,「展能基金」於 1990 年6月成立,各類弱能人士均可申請,申請資格是每月個人收入低於港幣一萬元及銀行存款少於港幣三萬元,所貸款項可運用於購置日常生活、訓練及治療所需的儀器,最高的貸款額是港幣二萬伍仟元正,最長的還款期為三十個月此外,申請人需獲得一名有穩定收入的人擔保。

自成立至今共有十六人申請,全部獲得基金貸款購買輔助儀器 藉以協助過獨立生活 本會誠意希望各位將「展能基金」的訊息傳播 讓更多有需要的人士受惠如對「展能基金」有建議或可提供贊助機構的資料 請與本會聯絡 謝謝!

(一) 弱能人士輔助儀器製作服務

(二) 弱能人士電腦輔助儀器製作服務

這項服務的評估工作也是由我負責,然後設計、製作、改良及安裝符合個別弱能人士需要的電腦輔助儀器及軟件,當然,有關的專業義工的參與是不可缺少的。同樣,如果你需要這項服務,可以直接向本會申請或由有關機構轉介:

(三) 職業治療/物理治療服務

現時這項服務的對象是老人宿舍、老人院、護理安老院的老人,我會於院舍中舉行講座、示範及討論,加強職員照顧老人的技巧。協助這項服務推行的義工是職業治療師和物理治療師。對這項服務有興趣的機構,可直接和我聯絡,由我審訂是否適合接受服務。

(四) 關懷獨居老人計劃

近期,本會和彩虹及蘇屋邨的房屋辦事處合作,提供「社康職業治療」予邨內有需要的老人家。我會親自到他們家中提供多元化的治療,例如:自我照顧訓練、活動功能訓練、環境適應,建議合適的輔助儀器等等。
